From the Pastor's Desk . . .



CHRISTMAS 2017

As each Christmas goes by I am aware as a pastor that the number of times I will have the great responsibility and honor of preaching on Christmas Eve and Day are coming to an end. On the one hand it is an easy day to preach, for it is indeed good news and everyone expects you to preach about it. On the other hand, what new thing can be said, what new perspective can be brought to life, and yes it has almost all been said before. Or to put it the clearest and simplest and to step away from the task of preaching to what every Christian should try to do each Advent and Christmas, find what God is telling you in 2017 as you remember and celebrate the birth of Jesus about how God wants you to honor Christ today.

To think that a child born so long ago would still be the focus, in different ways, of so many people around the world is amazing. Not everyone believes in Jesus as their Lord and Savior but almost everyone knows about Christmas. God came to us in the baby Jesus to change the world and to change us. How does the story of the birth of Jesus speak to you today? What is this simple and beautiful story trying to illumine in your life today? There are so many ways to ask this question using the imagery of the story. For example, what are you not making room for in your life like the mythical innkeeper who told Joseph and Mary that there was no room for them? Maybe you need to follow the shepherds and see anew the great thing God in Bethlehem so many years ago? Or perhaps like Mary, God is calling upon you to treasure and ponder anew some aspect of the birth of the Christ? Maybe God wants you to join the shepherds in telling everyone about what God did in the baby Jesus? As you remember the birth of Jesus God is speaking to you. Hear God calling you in your Christian walk as you remember the baby Jesus.

It is my hope and prayer that the book we are reading and I am preaching on its themes during Advent will help you in this spiritual work. That our services on Sundays and on Christmas Eve and Christmas might allow you to grow in your faith, worship God, and be the person the baby Jesus came to turn us into.

For me Luke 2:11 brings the message so beautifully, 'For today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you, He is the Christ.' Of all the powerful words in this verse, take to heart the two

CHURCH NEWS

Thank you to the Robys for leading the decorating of our Church for Christmas on Wednesday, December 6. We will begin immediately following the 6:00 pm Community dinner. The once a month study will start a new topic in January 2018 and this class will go through May 2018 and the topic we will study is **The Women of the Bible**. MISSIONS CORNER

(This month we are highlighting : **The Lighthouse Shelter**)

The Lighthouse Shelter is a homeless prevention support center. Their mission is “to help rebuild lives with compassion by providing shelter and services to prevent homelessness and empower people as they transition toward employment, housing and self-sufficiency.”

The Light House is located in Annapolis, Maryland, and they provide “emergency shelter and transitional housing for individuals and families who are homeless as well as permanent supportive housing for women. They also “offer life-changing programs through a case management centered model that includes, counseling and referral services, basic life skills, and wellness and job training programs that help clients reclaim hope and independence in their lives.” They believe that with the love and compassion of staff and volunteers they can make a huge difference in the lives of many in need.

“More than 90% of the Light House budget is funded from private donations from individuals, foundations and corporations.” So donations are important and appreciated. They also need volunteers to help with many things, such as making lunches, working the front desk, weeding the gardens, stocking the pantry. Cedar Grove supports this mission each 4th Monday of the month in cooking a meal and serving it at the shelter. For more information, see their website at annapolislighthouse.org.

BOOK CORNER



Underdogs and Outsiders: A Bible Study on the Untold Stories of Advent
Tom Fuerst Abingdon Press 2016 93pgs

As some of you know I look to review an Advent or Christmas book in the December newsletter and as I was beginning to think about this edition of the Book Corner I was gathering my books on women of the Bible to begin preparing the Once a Month Study starting in January on the Women of the Bible and I grabbed this book from my shelf of women's books. To my delight it is a book about the five women mentioned in the genealogy of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew and thus I wanted to read it (and it is a short book) for two reasons in preparation for the women of the Bible once a month study and to have a book to review for this newsletter.

The book reads really easy and has questions, prayers, and a focus section at the end of every chapter. So obviously this book would be great for a five-week class on these five women. Who are the five women of the genealogy? They are Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba, and of course the mother of Jesus, Mary. Along with learning about these women and their stories one is also taught through the five chapters why these women are significant and their place in the genealogy. The book is so short so I don't want to go into much detail because I want you to read the book but one of the things about this list of women that I have always thought was a neat fact is that with the exception of Mary they are all Gentile women who either by marriage or coming to faith join the Jewish people. God does love the outsider. They were often underdogs in dealing with the established and powerful. But there are far more things to learn about them than this and the book does a great job of bringing these truths out.

If you are interested in some of the hidden treasures in Jesus' past as seen in the Gospel of Matthew's genealogy this book is the one to read by yourself or with a group. It will cause you to think not just about these women but about Jesus and what His coming to us means and how it should impact us, and if you think about it that is what Christmas is really about!
