Unfortunately, Peggy and Dick have now, because of health considerations, been forced to discontinue catering the Wednesday dinners. We have sufficient dinners on hand, thanks to Peggy and Dick, to continue their supply of twice a month dinners through March 2016. Now we need your help if our church wishes to continue the Wednesday night dinner event. We need individuals or groups of church people to accept the responsibility of providing the Wednesday dinner. If you or your group is willing to do this, either once a month or more than that, please contact the office or Bill Kline so that a schedule can be made for the dinners to continue. We normally provide dinner for about 50 people and the menu is at the discretion of the provider.

Please **pray** from now through May for The United Methodist Church as it will meet in May in what is called the **General Conference** which meets every four years. Many important issues will be discussed and some of them, depending on how they are decided, could have a great impact on the UMC in general and Cedar Grove UMC in particular. Over the next few months this newsletter will have information on the potential impact on our church of one of the most important issues that the General Conference will address. That issue can be labeled one of two ways, either "Is homosexual sex a sin?" or "Is the Bible still the primary authoritative book of our denomination?". This second way of labeling the question avoids focusing on one sin and also demonstrates what is really at stake. Please pray each day that the Holy Spirit will guide the General Conference and us as we face these decisions and their potential impact.

Scripture readers on Sunday mornings! It has been great having some different voices read the Scripture on Sunday mornings. We would love to have even more voices. If you are interested there is a sign-up sheet in the narthex and if you do sign up we will send you the reading electronically or inform you over the phone as to what the reading is. If you find the reading to be too difficult (length or them hard to pronounce names) you can always let Pastor Glen know you have changed your mind. So please sign-up.

We continue to have our **Wednesday dinners** at 6pm and we would love to have more people come out to them. Invite your neighbors! Following the dinner we have Kids group, youth group, and women's Bible study at 7pm.

The Tuesday Morning Bible Study continues to meet and study the Gospel of John. All are welcome!

BOOK CORNER



<u>Do We Need the New Testament?</u>
<u>Letting the Old Testament Speak for Itself</u>
John Goldingay IVP 2015 183pgs

Unless you read a lot of academic books or have a particular interest in the relationship between the Old Testament and the New Testament you won't realize what an unusual title this is for a book directed to Christians. You see the more common question and feeling for many Christians is to ask the question, do we need the Old Testament? You have probably heard the statements made such as the God of the Old Testament is violent and judgmental and in the New Testament God is loving and merciful. Further, many Christians, teachers, and preachers focus far more attention to the New Testament over the Old Testament to the point you might wonder, is it important? There have been many books written by Christians in response to the question of do we need the Old Testament, but this is the first book I have ever seen with a title questioning whether the New Testament is needed for Christians. Of course, the subtitle makes it clear that Goldingay is not really questioning whether or not the New Testament is essential for the Christian church (it is by the way what separates us from Judaism) but rather to defend the Old Testament's own voice.

The book is divided into nine chapters addressing various topics to explore this theme. The book begins with a chapter of the same title of the book and the second chapter asks a question even closer to the core of our faith, why is Jesus Important? The remaining seven chapters cover issues as addressed by both the new and the old testaments, including a fascinating chapter on the Letter to the Hebrews.

While I enjoyed this book and found it very thought provoking, the author almost makes too good a case for, "no, we really don't need the New Testament" that everything said in the new as already been said in the old. Now this is not Goldingay's position and in each chapter he makes it clear that the New Testament is important and needed, but he really does make you think. There are things that I disagree with in this book though. On the whole, Goldingay is on solid ground, teaching the Biblical truth and only on some points of emphasis do I disagree with him. Further, this book is written in more academic style and is a serious book. So readers beware!

I have read the book twice and plan on reading it a third time. Regardless of how you would answer the question that is the title of the book, this book will focus you on the key issues to address to come up with your answer. Clearly the answer to the title is yes and even Goldingay concedes that. But why the answer is yes and what that means for how we read the Old Testament makes this a fascinating and valuable book for every Christian who should know and understand why we need both the Old and New Testaments.
